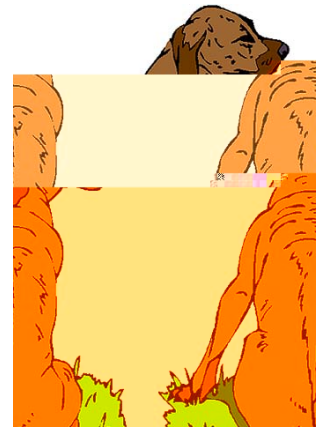


# Tail Tales

Whether it's long, short, bushy, or straight - there's no warmer welcome than a wagging tail! Specific terms describe different types of tails. Read the descriptions below and unscramble the names of the tails.



1. A curling tail, set high on the body, that forms a circle over the dog's back (Chow Chow)  
CLUE: You may wear one of these on your finger. G I N R tail
2. A thick, tapered, blunt tail without feathering that hangs straight down (Labrador Retriever)  
CLUE: Think of a small, brown animal that lives in the water. T E R O T tail
3. A bushy tail of long fringe that either hangs down or over the back (Pomeranian)  
CLUE: This is another word for feather. M E P L U tail
4. A long, fringed tail (Golden Retriever)  
CLUE: Birds can also be described this way. T H E E R A D F tail
5. A thick, bushy tail that resembles a fox's (Newfoundland)  
CLUE: If your hair is messy, you'll need one of these. U B R S H tail
6. A tail that has hair clipped to a round shape (Poodle)  
CLUE: This word sounds like what cheerleaders use. N O P M O P tail
7. A small curled or kinked tail (Pug)  
CLUE: You may need one of these to hold something together. W R C S E tail
8. A long short-coated tail that tapers to a point (Rhodesian Ridgeback)  
CLUE: Part of this word was just used to describe this tail. G T A N I P E R tail
9. A long thin tail (Great Dane)  
CLUE: Indiana Jones carries one of these. H W P I tail
